

#### Health Alert

Keeping your Dalmatian Healthy and Happy

Urinary stones occur commonly in Dalmatians and are most often composed of urate due to an underlying breed-specific difference in uric acid metabolism. Most urinary stones in Dalmatians occur in the urinary bladder; however, some believe that many Dalmatians form kidney stones. Urate stones may go undetected because they are not easily seen by standard x-ray techniques. If kidney stones go undetected, they may induce disease such as kidney failure, recurrent bladder stones, discomfort, and bacterial urinary tract infections.

Because of the unique metabolism of uric acid, all Dalmatians from birth have the potential of developing stones. Diet, constant availability of fresh water and access to urinate all contribute to whether a Dalmatian will develop stones.

The RockySpot Rescue had two tragic deaths Rocky and Rory, in adopted Dalmatians last year due to urinary stone blockage. It happens fast and there are very few obvious warning signs. In the past two months we have had three very cared for former rescued Dalmatians Rhett, Tuffy and Sport rushed into expensive emergency surgery to save their lives, due to stones. This could happen to any Dalmatian and happen so fast you might not be able to save them. It is imperative Dalmatians are fed a premium, non-beef food, low in protein and purines. Add water to the food to moisten it. Check the ingredients of their dog treats too. Make sure they always have access to fresh water. Observe them urinate daily to insure urine is actually flowing. Have urine tested at least once a year, twice a year is better. Visit the Dalmatian Club of America's website at www.thedca.org/stones.html to read about this horrible Dalmatian killer.





# Heavenly Sent Savannah and Wilson

What a pair of liver beauties these are!! This obvious mother & son team was picked up as strays by the OKC animal control and were never reclaimed by their owners. No one bothered and the two old dogs were forgotten. Being elderly seniors, who are usually deemed "un-adoptable," they were put on the dreaded list to be euthanized. Not wanting their last days and memories to be of a cold, scary, hard shelter. RSR decided to take them, love them, and let them live out the remainder of their short time with us instead.

So on October 4, 2003, Savannah (Vannie) and Wilson went into rescue permanently. Trying to find a safe place for two fragile seniors in an already over crowded, very active environment was literally impossible. As a necessity, the two were split up and put in different foster homes. However, they immediately informed us this was NOT going to work as they both mourned horribly for each other and refused to eat properly. They had to get back together or they would die of broken hearts.

As a last ditch effort, they were hesitantly brought out to RSR and VERY reluctantly put with the other 40, very active dogs. Surprisingly and despite their age they thrived here. Both were living happy as can be to be together again, fed and loved. However, the last few months have been hard on Vannie. Pushing at least 15 years, older than the average lifespan for a Dal, Vannie could no longer rest for fear of being trampled or hurt. Even she knew she was now

vulnerable and at risk. With nerve damage in her hindquarters, she could no longer get up and get moving like she use to. She struggles forever to stand, but once she gets up she can run in small spurts and bark and chase the wind, which she loves to do. Then she falls down and the struggle starts again. Needless to say, the rescue and its 40+ younger dogs now make it impossible for Vannie to live here any longer. There were no other options for our Miss Vannie.

Then God sent a wonderful angel to foster both Vannie and Wilson till Vannie leaves us for softer grass. It has been a year since God Blessed the RSR with these two wonderful souls and there will be a huge empty hole here without them. However Miss Vannie deserves a place of peace and quiet in her final months on this earth, a place free of fear and worry. Currently she and her son are lavished daily with body massages, baths, brushings, hugs, kisses and treats. Vannie can now relax.
