

2008: Twelve years later. Dalmatians are STILL being pulled from kill shelters, only not in the massive numbers as before, but they are no longer young and easily adopted. They are now seniors.

Still results from the Movie. Only now no one wants to offer them a new home. Nothing has changed, only time.

Top 10 Reasons to Adopt or Foster a Senior!

- Older dogs are HOUSETRAINED.
 Most already know house manners and won't need a lot of training time. Less work for you!
- Older dogs won't CHEW THINGS. They are not teething.
 They have had years of experience to now know better than to chew things that are not theirs.
- Older dogs can FOCUS WELL. They have mellowed which allows them focus on things and to learn quicker. They are so much easier to train as they understand better.
- Older dogs have LEARNED WHAT "NO" MEANS. They have had years of experience to fall back on and NO was
 the first word they learned. They respect the word and the meaning!
- Older dogs SETTLE IN EASILY. They have learned what it takes to get along with others and become part of the
 pack whether it be human or animal. They know the ropes!
- Older dogs are GOOD AT GIVING LOVE. They are grateful for the second chance they are given and will repay
 it ten fold with their love. They will worship you from day one.


